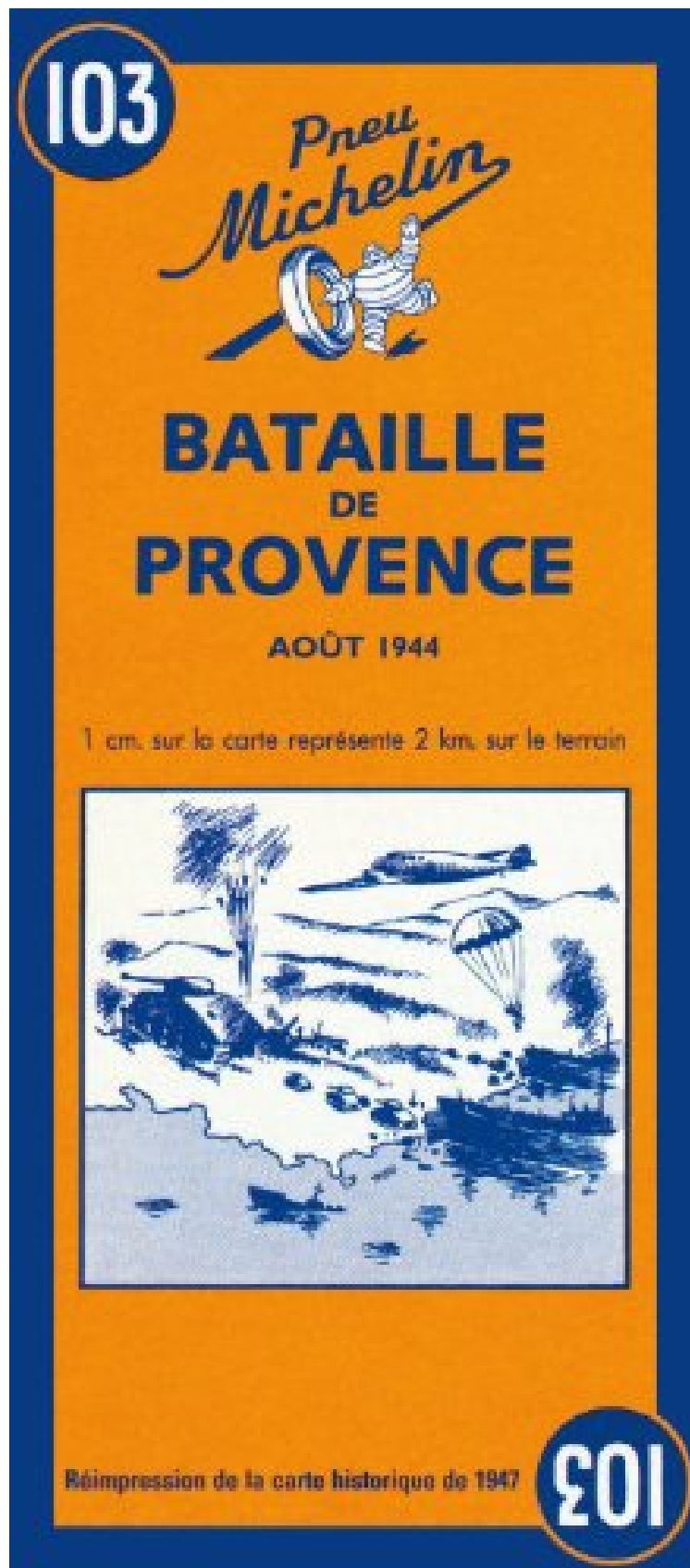

Historical reference map - good detail against published WW2 accounts By Peter Michels If you want to do research using old WW2 maps, this is very helpful. It is a 2 dimensional map. I wanted it for a wall-hanging (e.g. mounted in a frame). The map is folded, but a little steam "work" flattens it nicely. (via a normal clothes iron) If you are not interested in the historical view of WW2, this map probably has little value to you. I am an amateur military historian and found the map very useful for reference against various researched USA regimental histories. It is an excellent historical check-and-balance map (e.g. town names change, road names change, etc. from the mid-twentieth century). Although I have not used it in this way, it is probably very useful as an overlay of modern maps, if you are doing a WW2 tour. It is, of course, a map from that earlier time period, so you would have to cross reference memorials and monuments from a modern map and then find the associated reference on the Michelin map, if you were interested in that level of detail from half century ago.
