I'm a retired vet who lived in Germany for 6 years, and I'm a seasoned traveler who prefers to use a map over GPS.I did a lot of driving in Germany over a 3-week period during a recent visit. I found this atlas too "busy" and difficult to use. In other words, too much information is crammed on a single page. The city maps were also difficult as they were either over-zoomed, or not enough. For example, the city of Munich zoomed hard on the city center, and then too far out on the rest of the city to be useful. I ended up buying fold out maps in Germany, which turned out to be far superior and cheaper.This atlas is better than nothing and fine for major roads only, but I opted to leave it behind at the end of my

It did not show all the smaller routes we sometimes needed to take or details regarding exits and roundabouts. Also, we often found road signs differed significantly from the road numbers and labels given in the atlas.
