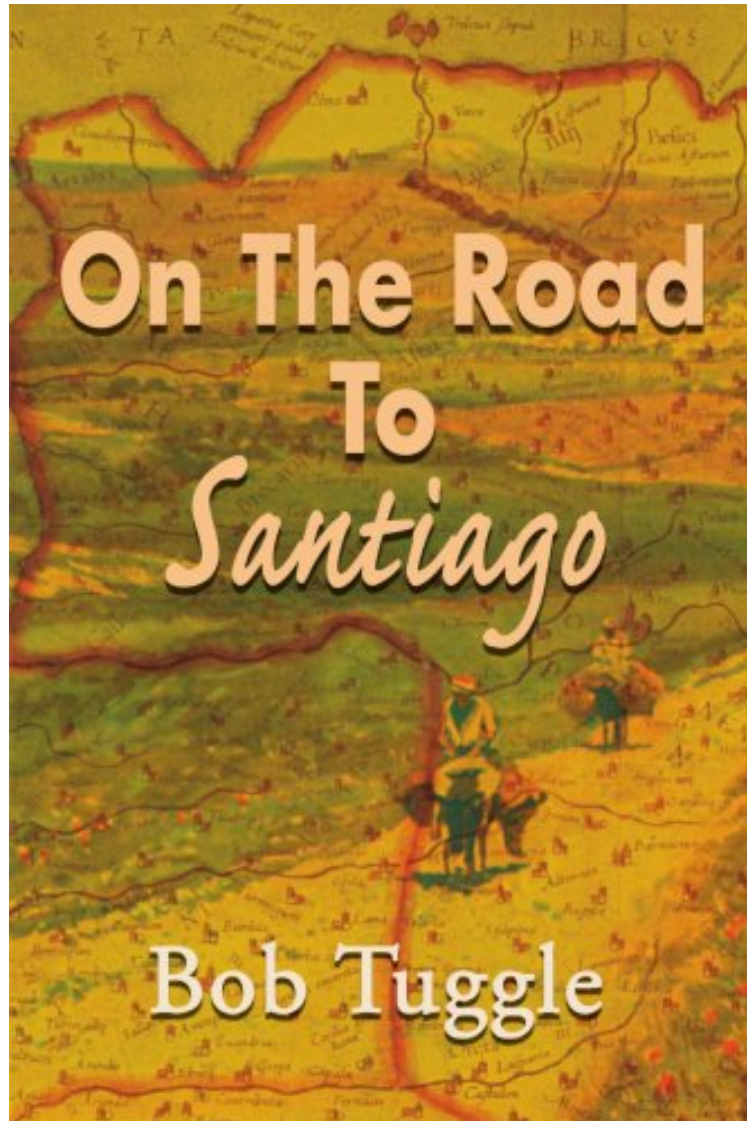

Could he pull the trigger on actually buying those airline tickets to Europe and committing himself to the journey? Could he thrive during the trek and not simply suffer through it? Well... yes, to both of those questions,

as things turned out. He had set Santiago de Compostela as his goal and, starting near Spain's border with France, he walked five hundred miles and crossed the finish line a little more than a month later. He tells us about the refuges in which he stayed and describes the individuals he met along the way. He does this in an unpretentious writing style. Example: A run-down village through which he passes "Reminded me of the small towns of Southern Illinois, in which I had lived as a boy, where a day could seem like a week, and people died of boredom."
