The maps are from not well done to barely legible. The problem lies not in selecting the BW convention of the graphics, but in a heavy-handed application of very thick lines, crude lettering, and monochromatic silk-screen textures similar in the overall darkness and shape making it difficult to distinguish between the areas of varying significance and meaning intended to look differently. However, the content deserves acknowledging of its merit. And the author is clearly a Polish nationalist For example, on the back flap, there is a listing of "Poland's Ten Most Important Victories" with Number 1 being in the Battle of Cedynia in 972 over the Germans. But this illustrates the value of this book--- it covers stuff that you won't see anywhere else. I am a fan of historical atlases, but let's be real... most of them cover the same stuff from atlas to atlas (Europe prior to WW I anyone?) Where else you going to

find a map on "Jan Zamoyski's Defense Line on the Danube, 1600"?
